## PRACTICE DIRECTION

# SEARCHING A REGISTRY FILE RULE 174 PROVINCIAL COURT FAMILY RULES

## **Purpose**

To clarify the meaning of "a lawyer" under Rule 174 of the Provincial Court Family Rules.

## **Application**

This practice direction applies to all court registries in the Province.

## **Directions**

1. Under Rule 174<sup>1</sup> "a lawyer" includes an articling student acting for a party or an articling student acting as agent for a party's lawyer.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Rule 174(1) Who can search files

<sup>(1)</sup> Unless the court otherwise orders, only the following persons may search a court file under these rules:

<sup>(</sup>a) a party to the court file;

<sup>(</sup>b) a lawyer, whether or not the lawyer represents a party, and including a lawyer for a child;

<sup>(</sup>c) a family justice counsellor;

<sup>(</sup>d) a person authorized by a judge;

<sup>(</sup>e) a person authorized in writing by a party to the court file or by the party's lawyer.
